RULES AND REGULATIONS

EXHIBITORS ARE REQUESTED TO READ CAREFULLY ALL RULES GOVERNING THIS SHOW. RULES WILL PARALLEL THOSE OF THE EC OR AS DECIDED UPON BY THE COMMITTEE.

PLEASE NOTE: CLOSING OF ENTRIES Entries in all classes will be closed on **July 17th, 2017** at 4:30 pm. LATE ENTRIES RECEIVED AFTER THE DEADLINE DATE WILL BE DOUBLE THE ENTRY FEE. (Must be post marked on or before the closing date for entries.) *Post entries will be accepted at double the entry fee each morning prior to the start of the first class of the day. Show is open to all equine, which includes horses, mules, donkeys and very small equine. Any change of horse or rider after the closing date will be considered a post entry. Double entry fee will apply.

NO STABLING ALLOWED UNTIL WEDNESDAY, JULY 26TH 12:00 P.M. (NOON)

No entry will be accepted unless entry fee in full accompanies it. Cheques can only be post-dated to closing date of entries (July 17th, 2017) and then that date will be used as the date entry received.

Please make entry from list of classes not from the day schedule. Exhibitors are responsible for making correct entries. No refund of entry fee will be made for classes incorrectly entered.

STALL SPACE IS LIMITED- stalls are allotted as paid entries are received in the office. Faxed entries and post-dated cheques will not reserve a stall.

Stall Fees: Tie Stall - \$15 for three nights

Box Stall -\$45 for three nights (limited number)

Priority for box stalls is given to Stallions and Mares with Foals. It is required that all stalls be cleaned entirely before leaving show grounds.

Please enclose separate cheque of \$5.00 per exhibitor number and separate cheque of \$20.00 per stall (cleaning deposit). Each of these is refundable.

All patterns will be posted one hour prior to class.

English or Western attire and tack accepted in Showmanship Classes.

Chaps are optional in Western Classes.

All competitors in English, Hunter or Jumper classes must wear hard hats with harness during competition and/or practice. Exhibitors without proper headgear will not be allowed to compete.

JUNIORS MUST WEAR PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR WITH HARNESS IN ALL CLASSES.

All numbers must be worn on competitor's back or on both sides of the saddle.

Shavings for bedding will be provided.

NO hay will be available therefore bring all your own feed. Exhibitors must furnish their own hose for washing animals.

Stock trailer parking will be available. R.V. parking spaces are limited and when they are gone there are no more. They must be paid for and booked with livestock entry \$50.00 per space. R.V. parking spaces will be allotted by the Light Horse Committee following a priority list. **DUE TO FIRE AND SAFETY REGULATIONS, THERE WILL BE ABSOLUTELY NO PARKING ON WEST SIDE OF OLD BARN.**

Vehicle Passes- there will be one vehicle pass per *bona fide* exhibitor/family unit. This pass must be fastened to the window of the vehicle so that it can be clearly seen and it must not be removed. These passes can be picked up at the Light Horse Booth.

No vehicles shall be allowed around the show ring or between the barns. This is required because of public safety and fire regulations.

No cooking in the barns

Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times. Dogs are not allowed in any building.

Physical abuse of horses, or the use of performance enhancing drugs or tranquilizers will NOT BE TOLERATED.

All entries must be on the printed forms of the Agricultural Society. All horses entered must be named on the entry form. Forms should be filled in and signed by the exhibitor. PARENTS MUST SIGN FOR JUNIOR EXHIBITORS. In all cases the right is reserved to reject any entry.

Directors reserve the right to correct any error or make any alterations to the regulations in the prize list.

Entry fees will be refunded only upon receipt of a medical certificate or veterinary certificate prior to the first class of the show. Certificate to be presented to the secretary at the light horse booth and refund will be mailed out at a later date.

Any exhibitor who makes a false entry or who shall attempt to interfere with or influence the judges while in discharge of their duties, or who shall use contemptuous or abusive language to a judge, shall forfeit his/her right to all prizes he/she might otherwise be entitled to, and shall be excluded from exhibiting at the exhibition for two years.

In previous years, the Vermilion Agricultural Society has paid 100% of the prize money awarded; however, if conditions should arise which make it impossible for this to be done, the said Society reserves the right to pay prize money pro-rata from the receipts of its annual exhibition.

When the total number of entries in any class is fewer than three the directors reserve the right to amalgamate the class with any other of the same type.

Where not more than two animals are shown in any class, no first prize need be awarded unless the judge considers the animal merits it.

Exhibitors are required to produce the animals in the ring for the purpose of being judged when called upon by the directors in charge, otherwise their right to any prizes to which they might be entitled will be forfeited.

Judging ring will be closed no later than one minute after completion of preceding class. Gate holds may be requested only with good reason to the show steward.

No person will be permitted in the show ring during the time of judging except the judge and their assistants, exhibitors, and the director in charge of the class being judged.

Any exhibitor lodging a protest must make it in writing with proof to substantiate protest included, and it must be delivered to the Secretary before the close of the show. It must also be accompanied with a deposit of \$50.00 cash, which will be forfeited to the Society if the protest is not sustained. The protest will be reviewed at the first organized committee meeting following the show.

*** Any exhibitor making entries, by doing so agrees to be governed by the forgoing rules. ***

Liability: All exhibitors shall be under the control and direction of the Ag. Society but solely at the risk of said exhibitor. The Ag. Society will not be responsible for damage, injury, loss or theft of or to any exhibit, irrespective of the cause of such damage, injury, loss or theft. Each exhibitor will be solely responsible for any loss, injury or damage done to, administered by or arising from any animal or article exhibited by him/her, for its description as given in the catalogue. This shall indemnify the Agricultural Society against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.

- 13 yrs. & under Exhibitors who have not reached their 13th birthday as of January 1, 2017.
- 10 yrs. & under 2 Classes for exhibitors who have not reached their 10th birthday as of January 1, 2017.

JUNIORS MAY SHOW IN THE OPEN DIVISION.

JUNIORS MAY NOT ENTER ANY OF THE SENIOR CLASSES.

Rider's name must accompany entry.

Juniors are not allowed to show stallions.

Parents must sign for Junior exhibitors.

- 22 Maiden Rider English or Western Equitation, 14 -17 years. Rider who has not won a first in Equitation in a recognized show, as of Jan. 1, 2017.
- 23 Maiden Rider English or Western Equitation, 13 years and under. Rider who has not won a first in Equitation in a recognized show, (does not include 4-H) as of Jan. 1, 2017. No cross entry to class 27.
- 24 Stick Horse- for kids of all ages, imagination and originality encouraged. NO ENTRY FEE. RIBBONS ONLY. POST ENTRIES ALLOWED.
- 25 Lead Line – No cross entry to classes 26 or 30. May enter Class 29 and class 108-Costume. NO ENTRY FEE.
- Horse to be shown with halter over bridle at walk**
NO ENTRY FEE. RIBBONS ONLY. POST ENTRIES ALLOWED.
